82 **PRESENT** Cllr V Price (Chairman), Cllr E Brown (Vice Chairman), Cllr J Carter, Cllr D Hood, Cllr A Hood, Cllr Fforde, Cllr Franks, Cllr Wells and Cllr Bate.

84 **IN ATTENDANCE** – County Solicitor Mr Pinney, Councillor James Gibson-Watt, approximately 35 members of public.

86 **DECLARATION OF INTEREST** None

87 **APOLOGY TO PUBLIC** Cllr Fforde read out an apology to the public, the wording agreed to by all councillors:

The councillors would like to extend their unreserved apology to the members of public whose attendance at the meeting on the 12th September was delayed first for a half an hour, then cancelled completely.

The delay was a result of an ongoing disagreement between the attending councillors regarding procedure, something of which none of us are proud, and undertake to rectify in the future in a more adult fashion.

It goes without saying that the public are always, *always*, invited to attend Community Council Meetings. We represent your interests, and you are there to scrutinise our actions, make comment, and bring us to account if we fail to do so.

We can do better, and shall do better.

88 **PLANNING MATTERS :**

On the agenda was a single issue: That of Cllr. Wells' Application to Rescind the decision of the CC to support the Poultry Shed application, P/2016/0397.

Cllr. Wells outlined his evidence as to why the decision should be rescinded.

1: Letter of impact from Tamsin Law, Head of regeneration (attached)

2: Evidence of sustained local opposition in the manner of recent petitions (attached)

3: A brief analysis of the application's traffic report in which he proposed that road safety would be compromised if the application went ahead.

4: A brief report of endangered species recently discovered in wet covert, an area to the south of the proposed application

The chair then asked councillors for their comments

Cllr Franks reiterated the road safety aspect, and mentioned how in his own experience, road accidents were not merely statistics but real, tangible, and with traumatic consequences, both physical and psychological.

Cllr Fforde asked Cllr Wells how many extra traffic movements the Poultry shed application would entail, and Cllr Wells answered that it was four movements a week.

There being no more comments, the chair asked it to be put to a vote.

Cllr Fforde proposed that it should be a paper ballot, seconded by Cllr Price

A paper ballot was held and counted by Mr Pinney. There were FIVE for the proposal, and FOUR against the proposal.

The Proposal was carried, and the chair announced there would be a future meeting in which the application P/2016/0397 could be rediscussed.

There being no other business the meeting closed at 19:52
